### Workshop Details

Originating out of the need for better understanding of our local natural environment, Conservation Education, Inc., was founded as a non-profit organization in 1954. Since then, the CEI workshop has trained nearly two thousand teachers and others interested in increasing their understanding of the natural world.

The three-day program will provide an opportunity to explore the fundamentals of Forest Ecology, Aquatic Communities, and Soil and Land Use. A hands-on Project Wild sessions is included in the Workshop and is underwritten by the FORWARD Endowment of Manitowoc County.

You will have a chance to visit lakes, bogs, wildlife areas and other natural features of the lakeshore. Experience the "bounce" of the bog, see and hear wildlife in its natural habitat and idyllic setting of the Kettle Moraine area.

Professional staff representing their resource specialty provide firsthand experience and knowledge. Experts from the Department of Natural Resources, Soil Conservation Department and Silver Lake College donate their services. Their reward is to see the interest that you show and knowledge you gain in their particular specialty.



Workshop times are 8am-5pm Monday and Wednesday, and 8am-6:30pm on Tuesday.

### Application and Course Credit

To apply, complete the attached enrollment form and return it with a \$25.00 deposit. The balance of \$150.00 payable to CEI will be due at the time of camp registration. The enrollment fee will cover expenses including food, program costs, and materials. Scholarships are available (see registration form).

An additional tuition fee (and admission fee where applicable) will be assessed if a student wishes to earn academic credit. One undergraduate or graduate credit is being offered by Silver Lake College for this workshop. Those interested in receiving credit may apply and

register the first morning of the workshop. A representative of the school will be present.



The workshop enrollment fee is paid to Conservation Education, Inc. All students must enroll with CEI. Credit tuition fee and admission fee are to be paid to Silver Lake College. If taking the workshop for credit, \$50 of the enrollment fee will be credited to the course tuition.
